- 12. What was the inscription and interpretation that was written? See verses 24-28.
- 13. The word on the wall, "TEKEL: You have been weighed in the balances, and found wanting." Leads the author to another judgment in Revelation 20:11-12, 15. What is this judgment about and who is it for?
